




Long ago, there was a beautiful princess in the city. The princess had a recurring dream where she married a young man named Kogoro Sumiyaki from Hikino Village in Higo Kingdom. One day, she journeyed with her servants to Hikino Village at the foot of Mt. Shodai. Kogoro was taken aback and initially refused to marry the princess because he was so poor he could not afford enough to eat. The princess believed her dreams were a divine message and persisted that he marry her. She gave Kogoro coins and asked that he go buy rice.

Kogoro reluctantly went to purchase rice when a white heron suddenly flew his way. Surprised, he threw the coins at the bird, which fell into a steaming valley. The heron recovered immediately and flew away. When Kogoro came home without any rice, the princess disappointedly said, "The coins I gave you were a precious thing called money and could have been used to buy anything".

Kogoro replied, "There are plenty of those coin-looking things in the mountain". Looking around, the princess soon found many gold nuggets buried in the mountains. Kogoro forgot his woes and happily married the princess. They lived prosperous lives and the story became the Legend of Hikino Choja, which means Hikino Millionaire.

It is believed that the white heron was healed instantly by Tamana Onsen waters. The "Choja-no-Izumi" (Millionaire Waters) is a spring located behind Hikino Shrine, which enshrines Kogoro.


